3.0 Communication from the Chairperson and President of UWbF

I welcome all of you to the 14th UWbF Annual Congress.

I would like to thank the Almighty God that has enabled us all to complete the year 2021, a year of several activities in line with Woodball development in Uganda. In the year 2021 we continued to operate under restrictions due to the Covid-19 challenges associated with the pandemic and we were able to have a few activities.



My heartfelt condolences to all our members, partners and friends who lost your relatives and loved ones in 2021. The Woodball fraternity also lost the founder of Woodball sport, President Ming Hui- Weng in March 2021. I request members of the congress to stand up and observe a moment of silence in respect of Weng Ming-Hui.

May the souls of all the deceased rest in eternal peace and may the Almighty God comfort all of you.

This being our first congress of our five year-term of office, we greatly appreciate all of you members for a continued commitment and strong collaboration and partnership as key stakeholders in the development of the Woodball Sport in Uganda. Your support has continued to add value to the brand of the Woodball Sport and enhancing the visibility of Uganda Woodball federation.

My address to this congress will be centered on the Seven Pillars of the Uganda Woodball Federation Strategic plan that was passed by last year's congress.

1. Corporate Governance:

Strengthen governance structures, capacity building and credible leadership.

We have continued to exhibit key elements of good corporate governance at the Uganda Woodball Federation. Capacity Building has been key where we have partnered with organizations like the Uganda Olympic Committee to have our members under the administration course. I would like to recognize the 2nd Vice President Ms. Luwedde Shahnaz, for having completed the Advanced Sports Management course together with other members who completed before such as Mr. Gerald Kavuma, Mr. Agaba Julius among others. I encourage members to enroll for such study opportunities so that we can build capacity at the federation.

Our plan is to ensure that we strengthen the governance structures at the

federation and club levels to have the sport develop well up to the grassroots. I would also like to take this opportunity to inform members that the Chinese Embassy in Uganda has supported capacity building and training to 8 federation administrators in line with managing sport organizations and remedies against sport injuries.

We have significantly enhanced the design and quality of our governance reports, data and delivery mechanism through the use of the latest ICT and other capacity building mechanisms

The newly appointed commission heads and their members will be received by Congress to serve for the next two years in their different capacities having been appointed by the Executive committee

2. Strengthening Resource Mobilization:

The objective of this pillar is to further diversify revenue resources as a sustainability mission of UWbF. (Operations and Capital Development/ Infrastructure). Last year, the federation continued to mobilize resources to support its annual budget activities. The federation has continued to lobby for government support to finance its annual budget activities.

Our focus this year is to ensure that woodball as a sport is listed among the annual priority funded sports of government. We have had an average percentage increase in government funding of 18% for the last three consecutive years.

The federation's expected annual income from the sale of woodball equipment is expected to grow by 50% on a prolata basis.

The expected funding from the Chinese government through the Chinese embassy in Uganda has been growing at a steady rate and we expect this funding to grow even further with the apparent commitment of the Chinese government to substantially support the infrastructure development of the proposed multi complex woodball project.

For the last three years, we have observed a significant increase in the overall budget of UWbF which is a sign of a growing sport. I think given our major prospect of kick starting on the major development multi complex project of woodball, we expect a substantive growth in the capital budget of UWbF in the coming year and beyond. This will be achieved with a support from Uganda government and Chinese government.

3. National Team performance:

Quality of athletes, competition and ranking Considering our deliberate effort to show uniqueness and have continued to run our federation annual activities by striking a balance between the national and international calendar.

The national team has continued to grow in performance considering the recent two international events we participated in. Uganda managed to win the 2nd Africa Woodball Championship that was hosted in Nairobi scooping 7 Gold medals out of the 14. We also had the Women's Double

Team win the International Virtual Woodball Championship having defeated Korea on the finals. Other countries that participated include, China, Malaysia, Thailand, Chinese Taipei, and Indonesia among others. Our focus is to ensure that our athletes gain more international

exposure by competing at more events such as the World Cup so that we can grow in the global rankings and make Uganda proud.

We continue to register a steady growth in athlete numbers in all the three categories i.e., Juniors, Seniors and Corporates.

4. Strengthening partnerships and collaboration:

In a bid to portray UWbF as a prominent and appealing brand to our local and international partners, the federation has continued to strengthen the woodball brand by enhancing the quality of the organization of its annual activities.

This pillar is centered at attracting key sponsors.

The federation has continued to maintain a good relationship with the current sponsors and partners amidst the pandemic. These partners include the Chinese Embassy in Uganda, Uganda Government, Ndejje University, Coral Coatings, Institute of Certified Public Accountants of Uganda and other venue partners.

We have also been able to attract more

5. Marketing and Development:

agenda. Four high tech seasoning machines have been procured and fully financed by the Chinese government.

We have also had developments in line with great achievements such as the recognition of H.E. the President of the Republic of Uganda by the International Woodball Federation as well as the First Lady in appreciation of their continued support to Woodball development in Uganda.

The federation continues to build Woodball as a competitive strong brand to attract key partners. This will help the marketing team develop winning proposals that can attract funding and sustain the federation.

We shall continue to market the locally manufactured Woodball equipment in Uganda, East Africa and Africa at large.

We have been able to have approximately 85 articles that have been run in both print and electronic media. Our social media handles are very active i.e., facebook, Twitter and YouTube, thanks to the

6. Internationalization and Professionalism:

The federation is working towards having an international outlook to create competitive strength looking at the brand quality and value of the sport.

We have maintained a great relationship with the International Woodball Federation as well as the Africa Woodball Federation to grow the sport. We also advocate for professional conduct and practice in all Woodball affairs at different levels including at clubs, schools, corporate entities, to mention but a few.

The President of UWbF is apparently the Vice president of the International Woodball Federation in charge of Africa continent and a member of the international federation finance committee.



7. Capital and infrastructure development

UWbF in its effort to develop and grow the sport of woodball has undertaken a deliberate effort to pursue its development agenda alongside the general operations of the federation. This is intended to address the budgetary constraints and imbalance by consolidating its capital budget from operational budget.

In line with infrastructure growth and capital preservation, the federation

has put a strategy in place to engage it's key partners like the government of Uganda, through the national council of sports and ministry of education and sports as well as the Chinese government through the Chinese embassy in Uganda to mobilise resources that will support the establishment of a multi- purpose woodball development facility.

This will house the UWbF offices, woodball factory, National cultural center, an international woodball course as well as accommodation facilities for residential training. I would like to inform members that early this year we managed to have the government to inspect the proposed site of the facility and has confirmed to support the project

- e) We have maintained our relationship with media and this has enabled our athletes get recognised by key media agencies such Real Star Awards and Uganda Sports Press Association.


5.4.2 Technical Commission







- ix. Solicit for sponsorship tagged to specific events and approved activities inter dem with the strategic pillar.



Figure 1: Comparative Analysis of Revenue




This year we report a revenue shortfall of 87.18% attributed to the consequences of the measures put in place by government to manage the Covid 19 pandemic. We managed to raise UGX 196,360,080 which is 12.82 % of the budgeted revenue. We thank NCS and Ndejje University for contributing the lions share, that is, approximately 69.7% and 29% respectively as indicated in the graph above. I also note that most of our revenue is generated from the efforts of the President and the finance commission in soliciting this financial support. Various championships, Membership fee, and subscription contributed less than 5% which trend is consistent over the years. We need to step up in this area.

In order for us to achieve this proposed budget, we need concerted effort to meet subscription, and also engage with our core sponsors.







Notes to the Financial Statements

1. Nature and History of the Federation

Uganda Woodball Federation (UWbF) was registered with National Council Sports (NCS) and is affiliated to IWbF, AWbF. The Headquarters of the Federation is located at Plot 264 Block 10 Balintuma Road-Mengo-Kampala.

2. Accounting Policies

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Federation are prepared in Uganda Shilling (Shs) under the historical convention in accordance with and comply with the Federation's accounting policies unless otherwise stated.

Income recognition

Members' subscription or any other income is recognized on cash basis except receivables from sale of equipment that is recognized on accrual basis. The expenditure is recognized as and when it is incurred.

Equipment

All the equipment is stated at cost less depreciation. The cost of purchased equipment is the value of consideration given to acquire the assets and the value of other directly attributed costs, which have been incurred in bringing the assets to the location and condition necessary for their intended service.

Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated to write off the cost of the equipment on a straight-line basis using annual rates determined by considering their estimated useful lives. The annual rates used are:

2. Accounting Policies (Cont'd)

Foreign Currencies

Assets and liabilities expressed in foreign currencies are translated into Uganda Shillings at the rate of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. Transactions during the year are translated at the rates ruling at the dates of the transactions. Gains and losses on exchange are dealt with in the income statement.

Receivables

The subscription not paid during the year is fully provided for and recognised in the year when it is paid before the member is reinstated to participate in the activities.

Components of Cash and Cash Equivalents

For the purpose of the cash flow statement, cash and cash equivalents comprise cash in hand and all deposits held at call with banks.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with IFRS requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts and balances reported in the financial statements and accompanying notes. Actual results could differ from those estimates.




