**H.E. Yoweri Kaguta Museveni** recognized excelling National sports federation and athletes for the year 2019 and Woodball was among, also the Speaker of Parliament **Rt. Hon. Rebecca Alitwala Kadaga** who paid a courtesy appearance during the 2<sup>nd</sup> Beach Woodball World Cup Championship at Spenah Beach Entebbe.

We are very grateful to the **First Lady Hon. Janet Kataaha Museveni** for honouring our invitation as Chief Guest of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Beach Woodball World Cup Championship by sending Hon. Mary Karoro Okurut as her representative.

The continued support from IWbF, Ndejje University, CPA Uganda and Coral Coating (U) Ltd has made us grow the sport day by day in the different regions of the country.

Winning the Inaugural Africa Woodball Championship hosted by Kenya on November 6<sup>th</sup> to 9<sup>th</sup> at United States International University Africa in Kenya and have seven (7) of our Ugandan athletes attaining IWbF World ranking for 2019 really calls for appreciation; **Adupa Joel** in the 9<sup>th</sup> position, **Kedi Thomas** in the 21<sup>st</sup> position and **Towongo Geoffrey** in the 25<sup>th</sup> position while for the ladies **Nanjeru Denise Pulkeria** in the 8<sup>th</sup> position and **Mukoya Florence** in the 28<sup>th</sup> position.

The UWbF President elected as IWbF Vice President for Africa for the next 4 years and this did happen last year in November 2019. We as a Federation have had all year round publicity in the different media stations and we commit to strengthening this trust.

Dear members of this august Assembly, I would like to remind you that the Federation manufactures its own equipment thanks to the support, from the Chinese Embassy that has donated 2 new state of the art Woodball manufacturing machines and our target this year is to enhance talent development in schools from the different regions of Uganda and we shall need at least 300 sets of Woodball equipment, and we seek the Government support for this equipment. The Chinese Embassy has once again pledged to add us another machine this year to boost equipment production.

I would also like to inform you that we are preparing our National Woodball team for the Woodball World Cup scheduled to take place on **24-30 July 2020 in Perlis,**

**Malaysia and I wish to officially make appeal to Government to support this activity.**

Many thanks to the role played by the sponsors in our developments to mention; the Chinese Embassy in Uganda, the National Council of Sports and Ndejje University particularly the Vice Chancellor Prof. Eriabu Lugujjo for hosting the National Federation offices and the Woodball Manufacturing Plant. We are very grateful for this partnership because without him, we would find a challenge to develop this fast growing sport. Other partners include Coral Coatings Ltd, ICPAU, Mandela National Stadium, Entebbe Municipal Council etc.

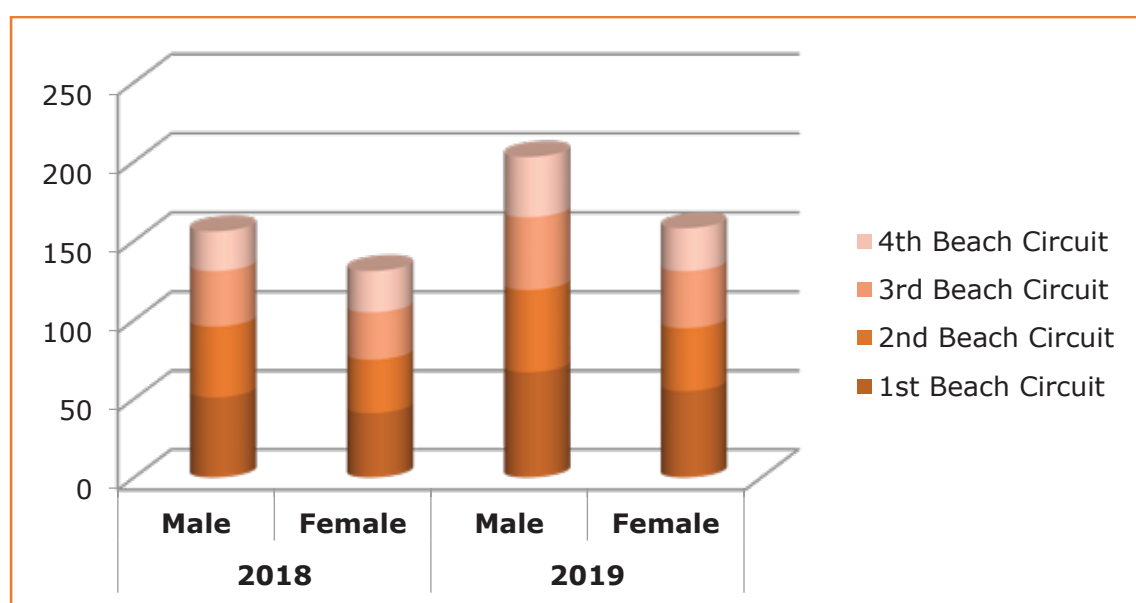

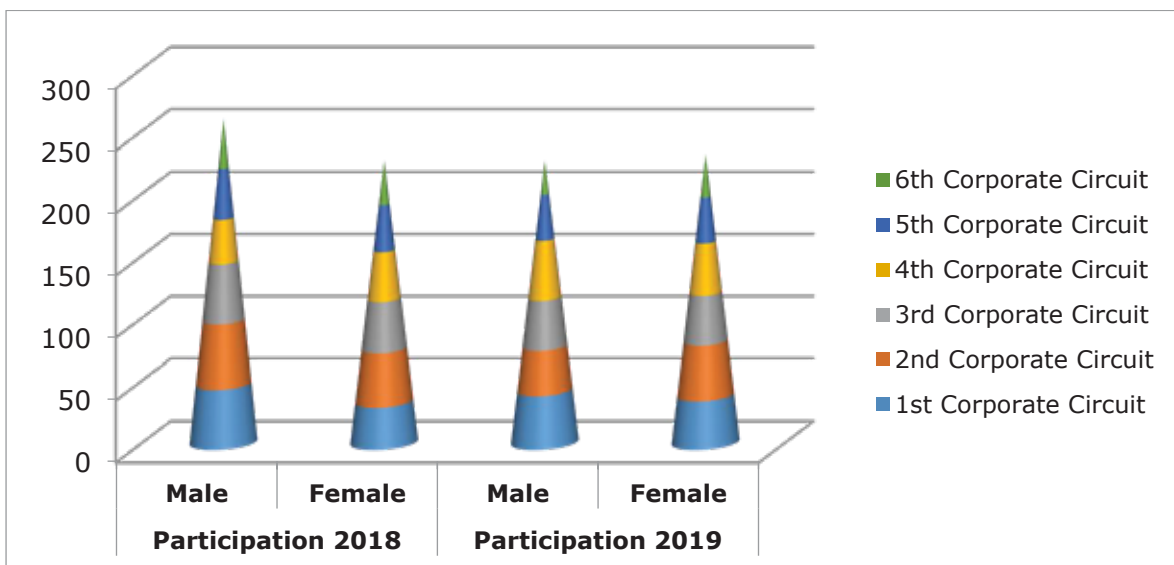




1. The above chart shows that overall participation at the Beach increased in 2019 compared to 2018

3. We recommend that Team managers should encourage their athletes to participate in the 4 circuits so that they can gauge their performance at the end of the year

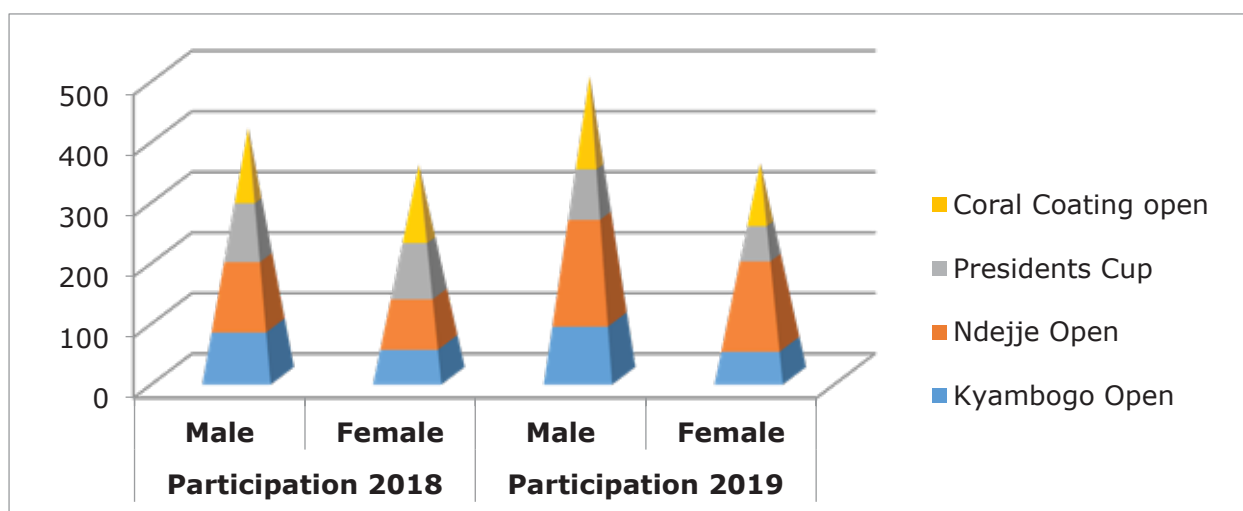

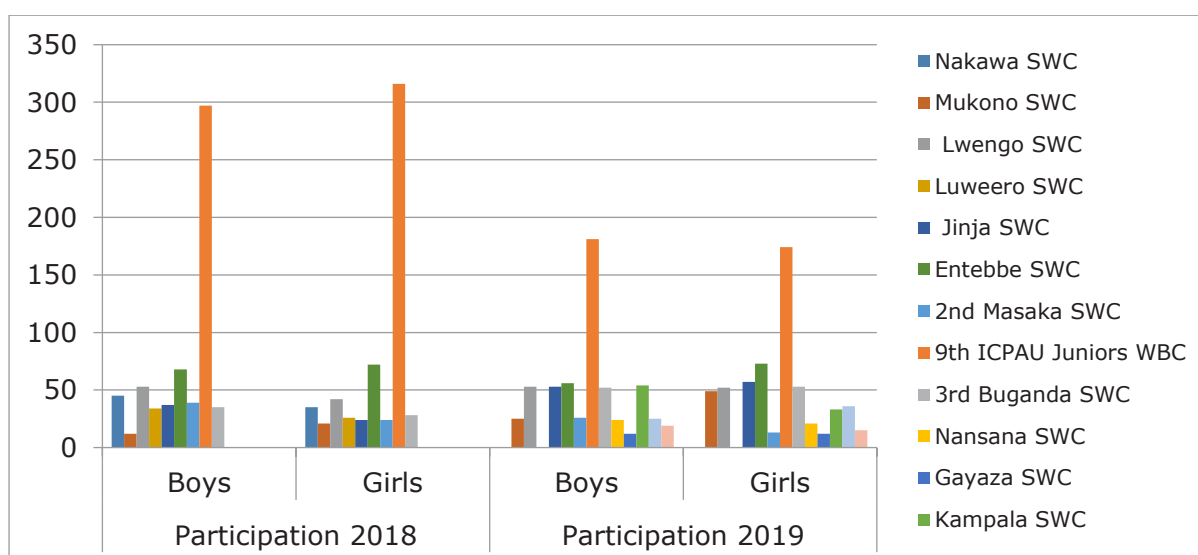

You may recall that 2018 was unique because we celebrated 10 years of existence but 2019 was even more unique because we hosted the 2<sup>nd</sup> Beach Woodball World Cup, the 2<sup>nd</sup> Africa Woodball workshop and the 6<sup>th</sup> Uganda International Open Woodball Championship. I highlight these because they stood out in terms of financial contribution.

Through the Chairperson, please allow me to present the achievements of the financial commission for the year 2019;

1. The commission worked to ensure that the calendar events are all run and have been to a great extent self-financing and this is in part attributed to the increment in participation fees for the different fees.
2. We increased the sponsorship base. On board came African Gold Refinery, Muni University, Bugema University, Buziga Islamic S.S and Uganda National Examination Board in addition to the already existing one, our very own Ndejje University, NCS, CPA, Coral Coatings, Buganda Land Board, Cipla Quality Chemicals, St. Joseph Technical Institute Kisubi, Chinese Embassy in Uganda, Spenah Beach, Mandela National stadium, Kisubi beach.
3. We implemented the finance guideline as proposed by the auditor (2018 report) and approved by congress
4. Witnessed increased participation of clubs by way of hosting corporate circuits i.e. Bugema University, UNEB, BLB, Kisubi Technical Institute and Cipla Quality Chemicals.
5. We received a donation of 2 sets of Woodball manufacturing machines

In spite of these achievements there are also opportunities that can be addressed to even further over financial health.

1. We still need to increase our fund base to ensure sustainability.
2. We need to fundraise for our dream of having a home of our own.



3. Ensure that debts are recovered from members especially those that pause risk.
4. Need to continue reducing the federation liability from members specifically the president.
5. In order to increase accountability tournament reports to be made to team managers after proper authorization.
6. Encourage teams and clubs that wish to prepay for calendar events to identify the events and pay as per the guideline that shall be put in place by finance committee.
7. As a means of enhancing revenue mobilization an agreed percentage charge be made in all championships organized by stakeholders.
8. Put the motor cycle donate by Dr. Jeff lin to economic use.

Mr. Chairman allow to present a brief about our financial performance.

As already mentioned 2019 activity calendar actionparked with local, regional, continental and international events. These activities had direct impact on the financial performance.

1. In the FY 2019, we were able to realize total income of 810,368,022/= which indicates a positive variance of 4.6% against the budgeted. The major source was form government assistance through NCS of approximately 512,000,000/=: Sponsorships mainly from the Chinese embassy of approximately 150,486,000/=: Ndejje University approximately 85,400,000/=: The open championships also yielded 33,119,000/=. From this performance it is clear that if we need to engage in more international events because they contribute tremendously to our income. We also need to intensify on the local activities to broaden the income base.
2. Our expenditure for the period under consideration amounted to 796,221,350/= giving a surplus of 14,146,672/=. Again our major expenditure was on the international activities amounting to 593,885,401/=: office rent of 62,000,000/= among others. This performance was a result of the stringent and frugal approach to expenditure. I thank the President and the finance committee for their stand on the approach.
3. We also realized an increase in our asset base by 11.6 % from 123,017,414/= to 139,307,380/=. This is attributed to the new Woodball

equipment manufacturing machine donated by the Chinese embassy among others.

Allow me Chairman to propose for the FY 2020 as follows;

1. An income projection of approximately 957,150,000/= with major sources being assistance from government estimated at 600,000,000/=, sponsorships 160,000,000/=, Ndejje University at 90,000,000/= and other sources as detailed in the Budget proposal.
2. Estimated expenditure at 953,695,000/= with major expenditure on international engagements at 653,288,000/=, Open championships at 74,650,000/=, rent at 60,000,000/=. Other expenditure Items are detailed in the proposed budget for the FY 2020.

Chairman I am confident that we can achieve this through concerted effort with your wise leadership.

## Notes to the Financial Statements

### 1 Nature and History of the Federation

Uganda Woodball Federation (UWbF) was registered with National Council Sports (NCS) and is affiliated to IWbF, AWbF, and EAWbF. The Headquarters of the Federation is located at Plot 264 Block 10 Balintuma Road- Mengo-Kampala.

### 2 Accounting Policies

#### Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the Federation are prepared in Uganda Shilling (Shs) under the historical convention in accordance with and comply with the Federation's accounting policies unless otherwise stated.

#### Income recognition

Members' subscription or any other income is recognized on cash basis except receivables from sale of equipment that is recognized on accrual basis. The expenditure is recognized as and when it is incurred.

#### Equipment

All the equipment is stated at cost less depreciation. The cost of purchased equipment is the value of consideration given to acquire the assets and the value of other directly attributed costs, which have been incurred in bringing the assets to the location and condition necessary for their intended service.

#### Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated to write off the cost of the equipment on a straight-line basis using annual rates determined by considering their estimated useful lives. The annual rates used are:

Computers and data handling Equipment	30.0%
Furniture and Fittings	12.5%
Manufacturing Equipment	12.5%
Sports Equipment	12.5%

**2. Accounting Policies (Cont'd)**

**Foreign Currencies**

Assets and liabilities expressed in foreign currencies are translated into Uganda Shillings at the rate of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. Transactions during the year are translated at the rates ruling at the dates of the transactions. Gains and losses on exchange are dealt with in the income statement.

**Receivables**

Receivables are carried at anticipated realizable rate.

**Components of Cash and Cash Equivalents**

For the purpose of the cash flow statement, cash and cash equivalents comprise cash in hand and all deposits held at call with banks.

**Use of Estimates**

The preparation of financial statements in accordance with IFRS requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the amounts and balances reported in the financial statements and accompanying notes. Actual results could differ from those estimates.
